

A Victorian Holiday Craft Exhibit Guidelines

Celebrating the Elegance and Craftsmanship of a Bygone Era

Purpose & Theme

The Victorian Holiday Craft Exhibit aims to:

- Showcase historically inspired or authentic Victorian holiday crafts
- Educate the public on 19th-century holiday traditions and materials
- Celebrate the art, detail, and heritage of Victorian craftsmanship

All participants must ensure their exhibits reflect the **style**, **spirit**, and **techniques** of the Victorian era (1837–1901) with a focus on holiday and winter themes.

2 Craft & Exhibit Criteria

1. Victorian Era Relevance

- All crafts must be *inspired by*, recreated from, or authentic to the Victorian period.
- o Acceptable mediums: paper crafts, needlework, wood carving, lace-making, handblown ornaments, candle dipping, calligraphy, etc.

2. Holiday or Seasonal Theme Required

- o Items should relate to winter festivities, Christmas, or New Year's celebrations during the Victorian era.
- Examples include: tree decorations, greeting cards, caroler accessories, stockings, winter wear, or decorative home goods.

3. Historical Notes

- Each exhibit must include a **brief written explanation** (50–150 words) that describes:
 - The craft's historical background or use
 - Materials and methods used
 - Any relevant cultural or regional significance

4. Authenticity

- Use of period-appropriate materials and techniques is strongly encouraged.
- While modern tools may be used, the final product should closely resemble historical examples.

5. Original Work Only

 All submissions must be handmade by the exhibitor or part of a historically significant collection (with prior approval).

Exhibit Presentation Guidelines

1. Display Quality

- o All pieces must be well-finished, clean, and ready for display.
- Framed works must be securely wired; textile works must be properly mounted or draped.
- o Fragile items should be protected in glass cases or secured displays.

2. Period-Appropriate Display

- o Table coverings, props, and signage should reflect a Victorian aesthetic (e.g., velvet, lace, greenery, brass frames).
- o No plastic signs or modern branding permitted.

3. Labeling Requirements

- o All items must be labeled with:
 - Title of piece
 - Artist name
 - Brief historical description
 - Medium/materials used

Submission & Installation

- 1. Submission Deadline: December 1, 2025
- 2. Notification of Acceptance: November 17, 2025
- 3. Installation Dates: December 2-5, 2025, by appointment
- 4. **Pick-Up/De-installation**: After December 21st, by appointment
